



# COVID-19 Vaccine Booster Dose

## Updated 10/26/2021

### *Who can get booster doses?*

On November 13, the Town will be holding a vaccination clinic and administering the Moderna vaccine.

The Town can now mix vaccinations between brands so if someone received a Moderna, Pfizer or Johnson and Johnson, they can receive a Moderna booster and vice versa.

The CDC recommends:

- People age 65 and older and residents in long-term care settings **should** receive a booster dose **at least** six months after their second dose of Moderna or Pfizer and two months after the Johnson and Johnson dose;
- People age 50-64 with [underlying medical conditions](#) **should** receive a booster dose **at least** six months after their second dose of Moderna or Pfizer and two months after the Johnson and Johnson dose;
- People age 18-49 with [underlying medical conditions](#) **may** receive a booster dose **at least** six months after their second dose of Moderna or Pfizer and two months after the Johnson and Johnson dose.

If you believe you have a qualifying underlying medical condition, please check with your primary health care provider before receiving a booster dose/shot.

The Town will be running a booster vaccination clinic on Saturday, November 13 at the Burrillville Middle School, 2220 Broncos Highway from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.
